

SIMPLIFIED RALLY POINTS SCORING SYSTEM IN RACQUETHLON

Tournament

Tournament formats and lengths:

Depending on geographical location, availability of sports/facilities, amount of participating players and sponsorship options/prize money, there are 4 formats:

GRAND SLAMS: Players play every second day of the tournament (approx 2 weeks)

TOUR: Players play every day of the tournament (approx. 1 week)

LOCAL: Players play during two days of the tournament.

or

FLEX: Players are allowed two weeks per qualifying round (one racquet sport a day)

Scoring

GRAND SLAM: **Men:** 5 games to 15 points **Women:** 5 games to 11 points

TOUR: **Men:** 3 games to 15 points **Women:** 3 games to 11 points

LOCAL: **Men:** 1 game to 25 points **Women:** 1 game to 21 points

or

FLEX: **Men:** 5 games to 15 points **Women:** 5 games to 11 points

The side winning a rally adds a point to its score.

The game shall be won by the first player (double or team) who scored 11th, 15th, 21st or 25th point (depending on a gender and tournament format).

Player(s) scoring the most points (not games) wins the match, however with the same number of points (very rarely), the side who won most games wins the match.

Serving

Each player serves 3 times each time (in tennis and racquetball: double serves), therefore serve change hands when total points of both players is 3, 6, 9, 12, 15, 18, 21, 24.

In badminton, tennis and squash players start serving from the right service court and when their score is even. When the servers' score is odd, they serve from the left service court and change sides with each point added.

The side loosing a game serves first in the next game.

The side winning a match serves first in the next match.

Change of Ends

In tennis, players change ends every 6 points.

In table tennis and badminton, players change ends in the middle of the last game (3rd or 5th)

Intervals / breaks

A 5 minutes interval between each game is allowed.

Scoring

Players are required to play all five games in each match.

The side winning a rally adds a point to its score.

For men, at 20 all, the side scoring the 21st point, wins that game.

For women, at 14 all, the side scoring the 15th point, wins that game.

Player(s) scoring the most points (not games) wins the match, however with the same number of points (very rarely), the side who won most games wins the match.

Serving

Each player serves 3 times each time (in tennis and racquetball: double serves), therefore serve changes when total of both players' points is 3, 6, 9, 12, 15, 18, 21, 24.

In badminton, tennis and squash, players start serving from the right service court and every time when their score is even. When the servers' score is odd, they serve from the left service court and change sides with each point won.

The side loosing a game serves first in the next game.

The side winning a match serves first in the next match.

Change of Ends

In tennis, players change ends every 6 points.

In table tennis and badminton, players change ends in the middle of the last game.

Intervals / breaks

A 5 minutes interval between each game is allowed.
